(Halifax, NS) – Celebrating some of Canada's most innovative theatre artists, Canada's **Magnetic North Theatre Festival**, in collaboration with **Eastern Front's Stages Theatre Festival**, is pleased to announce the 2014 Festival line-up in Halifax and Dartmouth, June 19-29, 2014.

Magnetic North is Canada's only national theatre festival, bringing Canadian stories to life on stage across the country. The annual event, which alternates between its home base in Ottawa and a new Canadian city every second year, promotes talented Canadian artists by showcasing the best touring theatre from across the country.

For this year's event, Magnetic North is proud to partner with Halifax's Eastern Front Theatre, a local company with a national reputation for speaking to the Atlantic Canadian experience.

"All of the shows being presented at the 2014 Festival in Halifax are underscored by a sense of urgency - a desire to break through," said Brenda Leadlay, Artistic Director of the Magnetic North Theatre Festival. "These are stories that need to be told in order for transformation to take place. In all of these plays people are searching for love or they are torn between their love of one thing over another. What makes all these stories worthwhile is that they offer the possibility of redemption."

The Stages Theatre Festival has joined forces with Magnetic North in Halifax to put East Coast stories and artists in the spotlight through a variety of productions, play readings, workshops, and talkback sessions.

"I am thrilled that Eastern Front is partnering with Magnetic North this year to make each of our Festivals bigger and more varied than they could have been on their own,' says Charlie Rhindress, Artistic Producer of Eastern Front Theatre. 'This is a wonderful opportunity for us and it will bring even more attention to our Stages Theatre Festival and Atlantic Canada's incredibly talented artists. By combining our two Festivals we will be able to provide eleven full days of wonderful theatrical experiences for our audiences and artists alike."

2014 Festival Presentations:

wag is directed and performed by Denise Clarke, one of Canada's most riveting performers, and features Clarke as she dances her way through a solo work of tender stories and beautiful music that will leave you exhilarated and uplifted.

Broken Sex Doll, written and directed by Andy Thompson with music by Anton Lipovetsky, Broken Sex Doll is a sexy, sci-fi musical comedy about a futuristic society where everyone is addicted to super hi-tech porn. Think Blade Runner meets The Six Million Dollar Man meets Glee meets Flesh Gordon. It's a "feel good" musical that's so wrong it's right! Company: The Virtual Stage (Vancouver, BC).

LEAR, directed by Philip McKee and featuring Clare Coulter, is a distilled and vital adaptation of King Lear that uses dynamic staging to present a modern take on the relationship between powers in decline, and the powers that stand to inherit.

When It Rains, written and directed by Anthony Black, is by turns blackly funny social satire, heartrending meta-tragedy, and visually arresting theatrical illusion- an acclaimed production from one of Canada's most heralded touring companies.

Stella, Queen of the Snow, directed by Jim Morrow, is the world premiere of a much-anticipated collaborative effort. Mermaid's stage adaptation of Marie-Louise Gay's beloved book tells the story of two children as they spend the day in the snow discovering the wonderful world of winter.
